distribution of any material created by anyone other than yourself may constitute copyright infringement, which is a violation of federal law and University policy. These prohibited activities include, but are not limited to, the unauthorized copying, distribution, or performance of copyrighted material without the copyright holder permission, whether through peer-to-peer programs (uploading or downloading) or other

with copyright laws and the provisions of licensing agreements that apply to software. In addition, all systems users agree in the Boston College Technical and Information Resources License Agreement to comply with copyright law.

Violations of this policy may result in suspension of network access, suspension of probation and loss of network access. In addition, under the Copyright Act, anyone infringing a copyrighted work is liable for civil damages. If willful infringement is proven, the infringer may be liable for statutory damages of up to \$30,000 per work.

infringer may also be subject to criminal penalties, including fines and imprisonment. For significant offenses, these penalties include up to a five-year federal prison term and a fine of \$250,000. Prohibited activities include using the Boston College network or software without copyright holder permission.

In recent years, associations

the Medical Device Association of America, and the Association of American Universities, have issued guidelines regarding the use of digital technologies. Boston College has adopted these guidelines, which prohibit the use of digital technologies to infringe the copyright of their members through peer file-sharing. Boston College may
